INVEST IN POSITIVE LEARNING SPACES!

Flex Space \$750,000

Situated in the heart of the infant and toddler wing, the flex space allows easy access to observation windows for these classrooms. It serves as an indoor area for large motor activities when outdoor conditions are unfavorable for the little ones.

Parent Resource Room \$500,000

The Parent Resource Room provides a warm and inviting space for families to meet with teachers or other service providers. It is adorned with welcoming decor and offers a variety of resources for families.

Pollinator Garden \$250.000

Our Pollinator Garden blends environmental benefits with scientific inspiration for children, parents, and staff who are able see nature in action as various pollinators interact with nectar & pollen producing plants.

Atrium/Common Area \$750,000

Upon entering the building, children, families, staff, and the community are welcomed by a spacious common area bathed in natural light from overhead skylights. This versatile space serves as a gathering spot for meetings and socializing.

Playground (2) \$250.000

Outdoor spaces are essential for active play, crucial for the optimal development of young children. The infant and toddler playground features age-appropriate materials for those aged 6 weeks to 36 months, while a separate area caters to the developmental needs of children aged 3-6 years.

Parent/Caregiver Drop Off \$750,000

The drop-off area in front of the center allows families to park briefly for child drop-off or pick-up. This area is particularly convenient for families with infants transported in carriers.

CONNECT WITH COMMUNITY!

Vestibule \$150,000

The vestibule, situated between the outer door and the interior of the building, provides an added layer of security. Individuals entering the building wait in the vestibule before being allowed into the main facility.

Infant/Toddler Classrooms (4) \$150,000

Classrooms for infants and toddlers are thoughtfully arranged with age-appropriate furnishings and materials to support healthy development and early learning (ages 6 weeks to 36 months).

Pre-K Classrooms (3) \$150,000

Preschool classrooms are equipped with developmentally appropriate furnishings and materials to optimize children's development and early learning. These rooms accommodate children either 2 years before kindergarten (typically 3 years old) or 1 year before kindergarten (typically 4 years old).

Observation Rooms (6) \$30,000

Observation rooms, located between classrooms, offer one-way views and serve various purposes. These spaces are used by guardians to discreetly observe their children, by early childhood professionals for classroom observations, and by students for educational purposes.

Mixed Age Classrooms (3) \$150,000

Mixed-age classrooms cater to children aged 2 ½ to 6 years. In these settings, children learn at their own pace, fostering a "family of learners" environment. Older children act as mentors, providing support and leadership to their younger peers.

Kitchen \$250,000

The kitchen is utilized for preparing nutritious meals and snacks for children and staff. A sliding window allows families to be served during family events or training sessions at the center.

BUILD YOUR LEGACY!

Child Sick Room \$25,000

The sick room provides a quiet space for a child to rest while waiting for a guardian to pick them up.

Classroom Outside Areas (10) \$20,000

Each classroom has a designated outdoor space that serves as an extension of the classroom for special activities such as water play, painting, or sensory activities.

Bench Seating (4) \$10,000

Bench seating around the center provides designated areas for families, staff, and visitors to sit, rest, and enjoy the surroundings.

Hallway \$250,000

Running down the center of the facility between mixed-age and preschool classrooms, the hallway provides access to six classrooms and observation rooms.

Director's Office \$50.000

The Director's office is a private space for administrative tasks, including meetings, bookkeeping, grant writing, reporting, and record-keeping.


Reception Area \$200,000

The reception area is where staff greets children, families, staff, and community partners. Reception staff open the door for individuals entering the building.
